

ABOUT KYOTO SANGA F.C.

Kyoto Sanga FC is a Japanese professional football club in Kyoto. Their major sponsors are Kyocera and Nintendo. The name 'Sanga' is a Sanskrit term that means 'fellow.' The word also reflects the

beautiful rivers and mountains in Kyoto - the kanji for mountain '山' read 'san' combined with the kanji for river '河' read 'ga(wa)'.

Founded in 1922, they are one of the oldest professional football clubs in Japan. The club was formerly known as Kyoto Purple Sanga. Purple is the colour of the team strip, and is the imperial colour, reflecting Kyoto's status as Japan's ancient imperial capital city. It was decided in 2007 however, that the team would simply been known as 'Kyoto Sanga'.

Star players have included Park Ji-Sung(previously Manchester United), ex-national team member Daisuke Matsui (currently Jubilo IWATA/previously Klub Sportowy Lechia Gdańsk/Poland), and Yuya Kubo (BSC Young boys/Switzerland).
